The Frankfurt Metropolis has come to symbolise the most important financial centre on the European continent with its banking towers. The trading floors of the German Stock Exchange are located right at the heart of Frankfurt. The eurozone has been monitored by the Frankfurt-based European Central Bank since 1998, and the Deutsche Bundesbank has been based in the Main Metropolis for over 50 years, establishing the framework for the German economy.

Extensive network of financial services

Frankfurt has around 200 banks from 50 countries which, in turn, have attracted lots more economic actors from the financial sector: Insurance companies, investment firms, consultancy services, auditors, law firms and investment analysts all form part of an extensive network of financial services across the entire Rhine-Main region.

Promotion of skilled young talent

Hessen's financial sector employs over 100,000 people, and more than half of them work in Frankfurt. The staff at universities and educational institutes like the House of Finance, the Johann Wolfgang Goethe University and the Frankfurt School of Finance and Management are committed to promoting the development of skilled young talent.

Frankfurt's status as an insurance centre is reflected by the 20,000 people employed at over 350 insurance companies, the European Insurance and Occupational Pensions Authority and the Frankfurt International Arbitration Centre.
